Academic Updates

ELA

This month in ELA, we will be wrapping up our unit on poetry. The students have been reading biographies and will be "publishing" an essay on a poet they selected to study. The next unit is on simple machines. The kids will learn how to read science text and to produce an opinion writing piece. They will also continue practicing decoding unknown words using prefixes and suffixes as well as learn lots of science vocabulary. Continue to read, read, read!!!

<u>Math</u>

This month we will continue in our multiplication and division module. We have started learning about division. This is going to be especially hard for those students who do not know their multiplication facts so please continue to study them each night

Science

This month in science the students will be participating in at least one science lab per week. The experiments will be done on small groups in class and the questions that follow may be done in groups or individually.

What Can I Do At Home?

As a team, the 4th grade math teachers feel that the homework provided to us does not adequately prepare students for the tests provided to us. Therefore, we will be sending additional homework home on the back of the multiplication fluency sheet. They will have problems to do each day that match the types of questions on the test and therefore they match the types of questions on their FSA test. PLEASE enforce this homework at home! We feel that this is key to them performing better on the tests! We will also be reviewing these types of questions in class. Their problem sets will continue to come home if they are not finished in class and will need to be completed and returned the next day.
